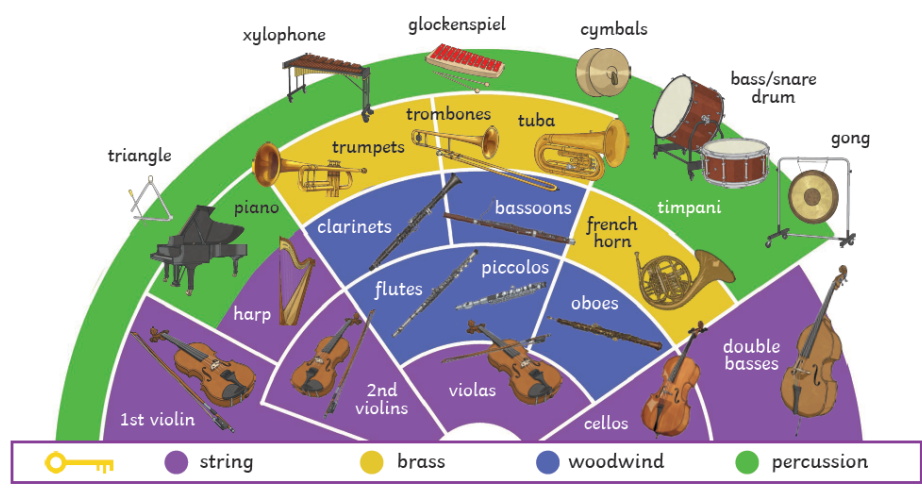
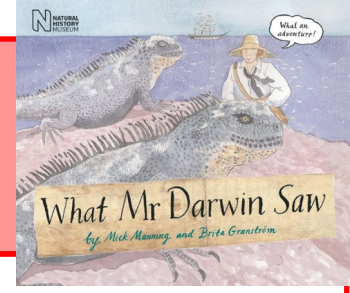


Would you have survived the Battle of Britain?



Australopithecus—Lived between about 3.8 and 3 million years ago in eastern Africa



Homo Habilis—Lived between about 2.4 to 1.4 million years ago in south and east Africa.



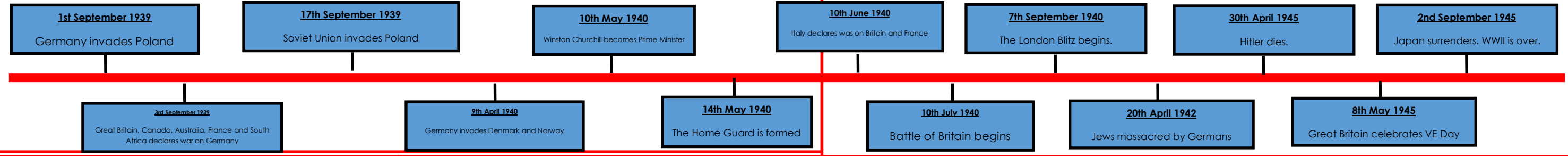
Homo Erectus—The earliest examples lived about 1.8 million years ago in Africa and western Asia. The species may have survived as late as 200,000 years ago in Indonesia.



Homo Neanderthalensis—Lived from over 400,000 to about 40,000 years ago in western Eurasia.



Homo Sapien - Lived from about 300,000 years ago to the present, all around the world.



- Air Raid** an attack in which bombs are dropped from aircraft on to a ground or sea target
- Allies** a person, group, or country that has joined with another for a particular purpose
- Blitz** the name given to the bombing raids that Germany launched against Britain in 1940, during World War II
- Evacuee** the children who were evacuated to the countryside
- Holocaust** a period in history at the time of World War Two when millions of Jews were murdered because of who they were
- Nazi** short for National Socialist Party (in Germany), a follower of Hitler was also called a Nazi
- Propaganda** a form of communication to distribute information; the information is designed to make people feel a certain way or to believe a certain thing
- Rations** limiting how much of certain foods people could take
